To be eligible, you must be a citizen of the United States or an alien lawfully admitted for permanent residence in the United States, enrolling or enrolled in an accredited four-year college or university, without prior sworn law enforcement experience, physically, mentally, and emotionally fit, and ready for the challenges of modern policing.
