## Cougars Conquer Conquistadors

(10/18/11) Clearwater came out strong against a strong Pasco Hernando team and won in three close sets 25-22; 27-25; 27-25. The strong blocking of the CCC team helped shut down the powerful offense of PHCC while on the offensive side Emma Kile led the team with a total of 20 kills out of 22 attempts. Her final kill of the match broke the Clearwater Christian College all time total kill record which had been held by Jenny Goodson since 2004. Kile now has 2,364 career kills with several more matches left in the season.

According to Coach Denny, "We are all so happy that Emma has reached this milestone. I never thought we would see Jenny's record broken, but Emma did it tonight. Emma has contributed in so many ways on our team, but what I appreciate the most is her heart for God. She is a fine example of a Christian student athlete."

With this big win, the Cougars go 27-6 for the season and will travel to Lake Sumter Community College over the weekend to play in another competitive tournament.

(10/21/11) The Lady Cougars added to their winning season with a solid win over Palm Beach State College in the opening match of the Lake Sumter Tournament on Friday afternoon. This was the second meeting for the two teams and Clearwater again swept the match in three straight sets. Senior Emma Kile continues to lead the Cougars scoring a double/double with 18 kills and 12 digs. Amanda and Richelle Bucklin both added 7

kills each, and Dana Medich finished with 5 kills. The Cougars get a short break and will take on the home team at 6:00 p.m.

(10/21/11) Clearwater takes the second match of the day at the Lake Sumter Tournament beating the home team 3-1. The Cougars dropped the first set after the Lakers came out strong with solid defense limiting the offensive power of the Cougars. During set two, the Cougars regained the offensive advantage while improving on their defensive end, taking the next three sets.

Coach Denny commented, "I am really pleased with how well we responded as a team after losing the opening set. Everyone stepped up, and we showed poise and confidence to come back." The Cougars were led offensively by Emma Kile with 19 kills, Amanda Bucklin with 14 kills, and Richelle Bucklin had 8 kills. Setter Sarah Wild led the comeback with 44 assists. Amanda Ison led in digs with 16 followed by Kile and Ponce both with 13 digs for the match.

(10/22/11) The Lady Cougars added their eighth straight win of the season with a solid victory over South Florida Community College. The Cougars were led by Emma Kile who recorded another double-double with 17 kills and 10 digs. Richelle Bucklin added another 11 kills to the CCC offense. Sarah Wild averaged 10 assists per set with a 45% efficiency rating. Wild and Ison also added to the defense

with 11 digs each. The Cougars are now 3-0 as they go into the final match of the Lake Sumter Tournament.

(10/22/11) The Cougars dropped their final match of the day against Polk State College in an exciting five set match. The much improved Polk team has been playing strong this season with a 19-9 record going into the match against CCC.



According to Coach Denny, "I was pleased that we were able to compete against this very talented team who were much bigger and stronger than our squad. It was a great match, and while we did have opportunity to win, we could not score at a few critical times during the match. This was a great game to prepare us for the last few weeks of our season."

## Cougars Defeat Southeastern and Chowan

(10/18/11) Clearwater Christian College defeated Southeastern University (NAIA) 3-2 on a wet and rainy night at the Southeastern Soccer Complex. Senior Drew Custer led the Cougars with 2 goals, and freshman Chad Broussard added a goal and an assist.

Only eight minutes into the match, Southeastern was able to grab the early lead on a goal by Stephen Eppinger. With 15

minutes left in the first half, Ben Holmes took a long free kick that was stopped by the SEU keeper but Custer came up with the rebound to tie the score at 1-1. The Cougars maintained the momentum

and with three minutes left in the half, Broussard took a pass from John Woodhall, beat the SEU defender and hit a blistering shot from 35 yards out to give the Cougars the 2-1 lead going into the half.

The first half was very evenly played with Southeastern holding a slight 6-5 edge in shots. In the

second half, Clearwater earned an insurance goal when Broussard hit a cross into the box for a Seth Dempsey shot that was initially saved, but Custer was there for the rebound to push the CCC lead to 3-1. It was Custer's second goal of the game and would prove to be the eventual game winner.

Southeastern came back strong as the Cougars settled into a more defensive game to preserve the lead. Shawn Meek knifed through the Cougar defense scoring for the Fire to cut the lead to 3-2 with 15 minutes to play. Southeastern continued to push for the tying goal in the closing minutes, but the Cougar defense came up big to preserve the win.

The win was another chapter in a series of close matches between CCC and SEU and was the 4th straight win for the Cougars over the Fire.

Following the match, Coach Whitaker commented, "This was a huge win for our team. I'm so proud of the way our guys battled tonight against a really good team. Hopefully, this will give us a lot of confidence as we finish the season and head into the regional tournament."

(10/22/11) Clearwater Christian College defeated Chowan University (NCAA II) on Saturday afternoon in West Palm Beach, Florida. The Cougars were led by freshman Jonathan Moore, who scored the game winning goal and also added an assist and senior Drew Custer who also added a goal and an assist.

The Cougars scored the first goal 20 minutes into the match when Custer volleyed the ball in from close range after Moore kept the ball alive in the box with a header following a free kick by Ben Holmes.

Moore would score the eventual game-winner when he scored from close range off a Custer corner to put the Cougars up 2-0 with less than 5 minutes remaining in the match. Chowan would pull within 1 goal with just under a minute to go in the match, but the Cougars would go on to prevail.

Clearwater had a 10-3 lead in shots on goal and 8-6 in corners. With the win, the Cougars improve to 6-9-1 overall.
